They will ask you some questions about your situation, and if you qualify, they will schedule you for an appointment at an Access Point for an assessment.

Hours of Operation:

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday – Francis House is not open on Wednesday.

9:00 AM – 12:00 PM and 1:00 PM – 3:00 PM

Direct Services:

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM

Doors open exactly at 9:00 AM. Clients will be expected to fill out a short daily intake, and service order will be based on the requested service.

DMV Voucher for CA-ID:

Please bring documentation with your name on it showing you are currently receiving government benefits (i.e. EBT card, MediCal card, Notice of Action/DHA printout, Social Security award letter) to be eligible for a reduced fee voucher.

Bus Pass:

One bus pass is given every seven days for verifiable medical, dental, or court appointments. Verifiable meaning a written, email, text or voicemail confirmation of the appointment.

Hygiene Kits:

Essential toiletry items are available upon request during normal hours of operation.

Clothing Donation Center:

Must have a Valid ID to enter. Up to 10 items per visit, one visit per calendar month. Open Mon/Tues/Thurs/Fri from 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM.

Additional services available at Francis House Center:

Family Respite Motel Voucher:

The Francis House Family Respite (“motel voucher”) Program Is only available to **homeless families** that include children under the age of 18 in their custody and with a maximum of **5** total household size, and is only accessible once per 12-month period.

We are only able to place one (1) eligible family for a 5-night stay, and beginning in August will do so on the basis of a lottery by walk-in and verification of necessary documentation on the **2nd & 4th Monday of each month between 1:00 PM and 2:00 PM**. There will no longer be a valid waitlist or way to apply by phone or email.

THE DIVERSION PROGRAM

This program provides assistance with utilities, first month’s rent, or eviction avoidance to low income families. Application process necessary.

Homeless Verification and Birth Certificate Affidavits for Homeless Individuals:

Francis House Center does not currently verify homelessness as a 3rd Party. Birth certificate fee waiver affidavits are available to any homeless individual who can provide 3rd Party verification or proof of currently living in a homeless shelter.

“New Eyes” Eye Glass Voucher Program:

Low income and homeless individuals are eligible to receive one free pair of eyeglasses per year.

You must be able to provide:

- A recent eyeglass prescription from the last 12 months
- Your pupillary distance measurement
- Proof of income

Open Resource Lab:

Tuesdays and Thursday, 9am-12pm. The computer lab is open to any adults who enroll and offers access to the internet.

MOTEL VOUCHERS

CalWORKS:

The CalWORKs Homeless Assistance (HA) Program was established to help families in the CalWORKs program with emergency shelter when a family is experiencing homelessness. CalWORKs HA program serves eligible CalWORKs recipients or apparently eligible CalWORKs applicants, who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. CalWORKs Temporary HA can provide payments for temporary shelter for up to 16 days. Families experiencing homelessness should go into a DHA office (except 1725 28th Street) to get assessed for Homeless Assistance.
